








Network Plan

 - Establish, manage, support, and coordinate your
 Network in order to make an impact
 - Structure innovator competitions
 - Continuously monitor, learn, improve, and adapt
 - Equitably engage and communicate with stakeholders
- You will adapt your Network plans now, and continuously to meet shifting forces (e.g., Covid-19, Network feedback, new partners)








5 Key Collaboration Resources

Technical Assistance

Support	Purpose
Cohort Buddies	Your personal Creative Support Team; leverage each other's expertise, impartiality, and ingenuity; workshop key planning documents and vision together
Cohort Workshops	Time to share across cohort
Guidance + Office Hours	OPA to share guidance to help grantees meet expectations; office hours to provide open space to ask questions and connect
Guest Speakers + Trainings	Special events, topics (i.e. STI training); to learn or refresh content or skills
Project Officer	Review key project documents with individual grantees; helps make connections across projects
MAX.gov	Track documents, share documents. Easy, online feedback on project documents.
Training and TA Center	Grant to support you! (and other TPP/Title X grantees). Excited about "Peer Learning Groups" and affinity clusters. They are newly awarded, and will be getting up to speed over the next few months too.
Evaluation Technical Assistance	To support rigorous intervention testing To support monitoring and improving efforts for the overall network/grant


Intros


- o (2 min) Buddy 1 shares network visualization

 - (10 min) Buddies discuss interpretations of visual and implications for KPA
 - Question ideas: Who are the key partners and their roles? How does Network structure enable/inhibit collaboration? Equity? Nimbleness and adaptability? How aligned are the impact statement and Network composition and structure?
