Annual staff training on state- and grantee-specific policies and procedures is recommended. Staff should also be trained on the topics in the chart below at least once per project period. Other specific content requirements for each staff member should be based on role and function. ### **Voluntary and Non-Coercive Services**

(Sections 1001 & 1007, PHS Act; 42CFR 59.5(a)(2))\*

Staff must be informed that family planning services are to be provided solely on a voluntary basis.

### Services Not a Prerequisite for Eligibility or Services

(Sections 1001 & 1007, PHS Act; 42CFR 59.5(a)(2))

Staff must be informed that a client's acceptance of family planning services must not be a prerequisite to eligibility for, or receipt of, any other services, assistance from, or participation in any other program that is offered by the service site or any other program grantee or subrecipient.

#### **Personnel Awareness**

(Section 205, Public Health Law 94-63, 42CFR 59.5(a)(2) footnote 1)

Staff must be informed that that they may be subject to prosecution if they coerce or try to coerce any person to undergo an abortion or sterilization procedure.

### **Client-Centered Services**

(42CFR 59.5(a)(3))

Project staff should provide services in a manner that is client-centered, culturally and linguistically appropriate, inclusive, and trauma-informed; protects the dignity of the individual; and ensures equitable and quality service delivery consistent with nationally recognized standards of care.

### **Personnel Training**

(42CFR 59.5(b)(4))

Projects must provide for the orientation and in-service training of all project personnel, including the staff of sub-recipient agencies and service sites.

# State Reporting Requirements: Mandatory Reporting for Abuse, Rape, Incest, and Human Trafficking

(Legislative Mandate)

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no provider of services under Title X of the Public Health Service Act shall be exempt from any State law requiring notification or the reporting of child abuse, child molestation, sexual abuse, rape, or incest

### **Family Involvement and Coercion**

(Legislative Mandate)

None of the funds appropriated in this Act may be made available to any entity under Title X of the Public Health Service Act unless the applicant for the award certifies to the Secretary that it encourages family participation in the decision of minors to seek family planning services and that it provides counseling to minors on how to resist attempts to coerce minors into engaging in sexual activities.

## **Non-Discriminatory Services**

(42CFR 59.5(a)(4))

Staff must be informed that services must be provided without regard to religion, race, color, national origin, disability, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, sex characteristics, number of pregnancies, or marital status.

### Training to Support Implementation of QFP

<u>Providing Quality Family Planning Services (QFP)</u> recommendations were developed by the Office of Population Affairs (OPA) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
