Mental health conditions are a leading cause of maternal mortality, yet often go unaddressed. This job aid presents high impact practices to respond to mental health conditions in the outpatient sexual and reproductive health setting, along with resources to support implementation.

Recognition and Prevention

Screen for structural and social drivers of health that might impact clinical recommendations or treatment plans. Link clients to resources that align with their health literacy, cultural needs, and language proficiency.
