## **Formative versus summative evaluation**







## **Formative evaluation**

- Informs program creation, monitoring, or improvement
- Tests part or all of the program in one round or a series of rounds
  - Rapid cycle evaluation is a kind of formative evaluation
- Small scale or large scale
- Can reveal if the program is ready for summative evaluation




## **Summative evaluation**

- Assess whether a program works
- Typically done with a large sample

## **Needs assessment**

- Which populations of youth need these services?
- What existing programs might address the needs and strengths of these youth?
- How can a program be developed for this population? OR Is the selected program a good fit, or is there a better alternative?
- Is the planned program feasible in this setting?
- How should you adjust the program to meet the needs of the youth you are serving?



## Implementation study

- Did the adaptation made to the visuals resonate with the population?
- Did staff understand the policy change as written?
- Did participants understand the survey questions as you intended?
- Did facilitators feel prepared to implement the program (component)? Did they think youth responded to it?
- Was it implemented with fidelity? Did youth receive the intended dose?
- Were participants engaged? Did they like the program (component)?




## **Outcome study**

- Is there evidence to suggest outcomes improved for participants?
- Is there evidence to suggest that some types of youth might benefit more than others?
- What is the maximum amount of change in an outcome we might expect to see in a future impact evaluation?






## Which program moved sexual initiation rates best?





## **Reassessing which program moved sexual initiation rates best**




## **Outcome studies versus impact studies**

Outcome	Impact
Can be done with a smaller sample	Requires a large sample of individuals or sites
Less expensive	More expensive
Can inform impact evaluation readiness, measurement, and practices	Could be challenging to find and convince comparison youth or sites to participate
Presents information on how outcomes changed over time	Presents information on how program or practice <i>caused</i> the changes in outcome over time

## **Economic studies**

- A cost study is the systematic collection, categorization, and analysis of a program's costs
  - How much does it cost to implement Program X in a school?
- A cost-effectiveness study produces metrics that reveal the cost of achieving a change in a specific outcome of interest
  - What is the most cost-effective option to reduce rates of teen pregnancy?
- A cost-benefit study determines whether a program's costs were lower than the value of its benefits (in monetary units), which indicates whether the program was an efficient use of resources
  - Do the benefits of Program X outweigh its cost?



## Systems change study

- Who is part of the network or system, and how did membership change over time?
- What is the nature of collaboration between participating organizations within the system, and did it change over time?
- After the intervention started, were there changes in policies, practice, or resource flows?
